There is no charge to attend this conference, places will be allocated on a first come first served basis. Please find the full agenda and booking form on the following pages.

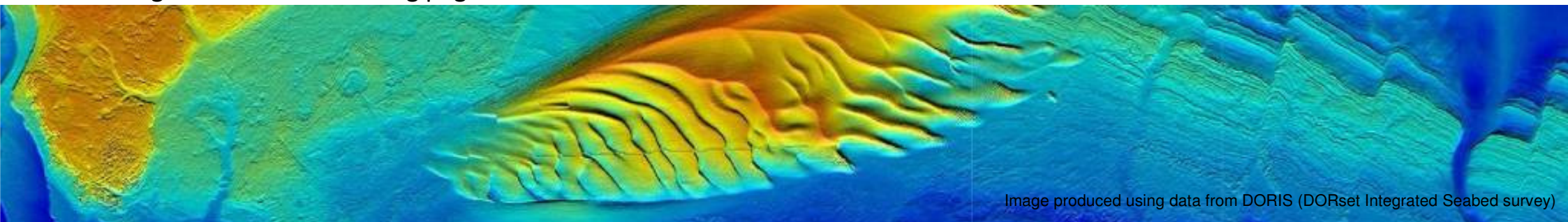

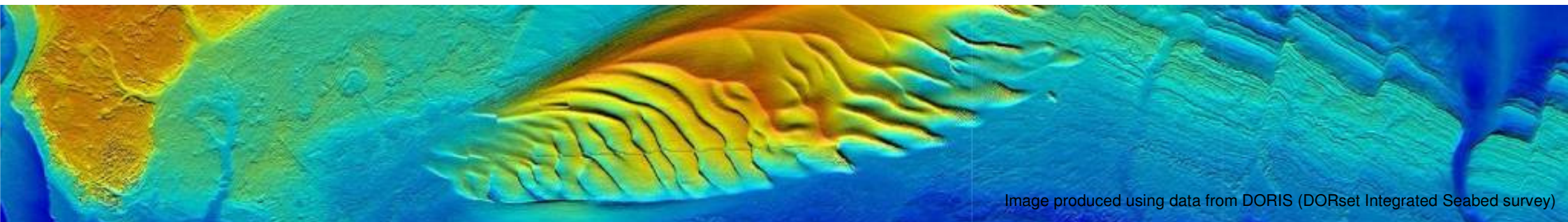
