




On the origin of the specimen Belgian Coastal Forum: creation


 yearbook as backbone = compilation of news headlines by journalist specialised in coast related topics





Provincie West-Vlaanderen Door mensen gedreven The specimen Belgian Coastal Forum: statistics



























- > adapted to its environment ?

* interactivity: plus/minus OK (little interference of audience in the discussions, nor in the establishment of the agenda; "debates" are in reality talks, only local politicians questioned, no consultation of the "average" coastal inhabitant, some sectors demand permanent involvement) (no function as formal advisory board (too large scale, nor as a body for policy evaluation) But was not meant to be so
